Florida 4-H Youth Development strengthens communities by providing a positive future for youth. As the youth development program of the University of Florida IFAS Extension, Florida 4-H uses a learn-by-doing approach to enable youth, ages 5-18, to develop the knowledge, attitudes, and skills they need to become competent, caring and contributing citizens of the world.

As the largest youth organization in the world, 4-H has over 8 million members nationwide, including 263,000 in Florida. Through award-winning programs, Florida 4-H offers youth fun, safe, and inclusive learning environments to meet their need for belonging, through 4-H clubs, after school programs, special interest, school enrichment programs, and camping.

Florida 4-H programs are conducted at the local county level and guided by county Extension/4-H agents and the volunteers they recruit and train. Florida 4-H uses best practices to interest youth in learning, including: experiential learning (learn-by-doing), youth-adult partnerships, fun curriculum materials, and activities such as contests & events, community service projects, and collaborations with other youth-serving agencies and organizations on a local, regional, state and national levels.
